Strawberry Pod

As the outdoor area in the strawberry pod is a little smaller than the other areas the children have been enjoying using the softplay area and garden in the school after the children have left. During the October break they have been in the garden lots, even having a picnic snack. The children are keen to keep using the garden so if they are not around when call to pick up just give us a call and we will get them back for you.

Indoors the children have been involved in lots of role play. They have been using their imagination and the resources in the construction area to create their own spaces, building kitchens and bedrooms and then using these in their play.

Banana Pod

The children have set up an ice cream shop in the garden. Talking about how many scoops they want and the prices of each type of ice cream. The children were also using checklists "ticking off" orders for when completed them. We added menus and signs for the children to look at and they used these in their play.

They turned the mud kitchen into a shop and were using clipboards to take orders.

Donna has introduced story stars We're going on a Bear Hunt, the children are really enjoying the story and using the props for each part of it.

Due to the children's interests in shops and café we introduced money. Looking at it, talking about if they have money, how they save it etc. and all the different coins we use to make 10p.



Baby Room

We have had new children starting in the baby room and have been working hard to ensure they are happy and settled.

All the children enjoy stories and rhymes and this is helping them to learn new words. Some of the children have either just started walking or trying really hard so staff are providing lots of opportunities for them to practise these new skills both indoors and outdoors.
