

Family Learning Planner - Session 20-21



The current situation has implications for how we run our family learning sessions for now and we are trying to be creative as possible in order to reach as many families as possible. For the time being, we have the added consideration of Covid19 and related risk assessment considerations. We also continue to operate our class bubble model to support the Government's 'Track, Trace, Protect' procedures which means children and families across the school can't work in mixed class groups for the time being. Where activities require an individual risk assessment you will be given a copy in advance of your session and we'll also talk you through it! We have marked individually risk assessed activities for your information. With all of this in mind we have modified our programme and we warmly invite you to engage where and when you can!

Intervention	Description	Timeframe/other information
Story Sacks	<p>This intervention is aimed at all Primary 1 families.</p> <p>Each Story Sack contains a popular children's book, game and prop for parents and their child to engage in together at home. Families Connect (within school day)	<p>Families Connect focuses on supporting parents and children to learn together. It helps parents to support their children's learning in three key areas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Literacy and language development • Numeracy • Emotional development <p>The eight-week programme provides a series of activities, techniques and games that parents and carers can do with their children at home. Each activity encourages parents and children to spend quality time together by talking about specific topics and reflecting on what they already do to support their children's learning.
