2-3 Room

The 2-3 room children have been fascinated by the changes in the weather recently. They have been talking about how cold it is now and they were delighted to find some ice in our outdoor water tray. They were keen to explore the ice using their senses and have shown lots of interest in how it is formed.... more to follow on this.

They have also been very curious about different types of bugs. We had a great time exploring in the big school garden using magnifiers to find all sorts of bugs and insects. The children then did fabulous drawings and paintings of the bugs they saw and have created some wonderful wall displays.

This very busy month also found the children expressing an interest in People Who Help Us and can now describe what most of the emergency services do for us. They designed and created their own ambulance and have had lots of using it during role play.

We are now all looking forward to all the exciting Christmas activities and experiences

3-5 Room Strawberry Pod

In the strawberry pod this month we have been exploring our problem solving skills through putting together lots of puzzles and exploring our construction area. There have been some very impressive towers created, some even as high as the children. During this time, we have been discussing measurement words and comparing things using the words bigger, smaller, tall and short.

Outside in the garden the children have particularly enjoyed playing with our new mud kitchen, handcrafted personally by Jennifer, they have been making pretend cakes, bread and even some sparkly potions. Water play is particularly popular at the moment in the garden as children fill containers, pour them from one to another and create their own muddy puddles. This is developing their balance, co-ordination and sharing skills.

Our home corner has had a move around recently and the children are spending lots of time playing families. This includes looking after the toy babies, setting up dinner tables and putting the children to bed. During these games children are increasing their knowledge of how to interact and play games with each other but also developing their understanding of how to look after babies and smaller children.

Across the room we are looking at developing children's counting skills. We are encouraging children to count the correct amount at lunchtime, counting out and sharing toys and also encouraging them to correctly count in order from 0-20. As the children's confidence increases with this task we will begin to look at counting out the correct amount of objects to match a given number.





3-5 Room Banana Pod

We have been developing our knowledge of science and engineering through experiments and exploration of resources. While we have been focusing on our senses this week we were learning about sight through activities such as exploring light and dark.

The children have been expanding their imagination through creative re-enacting of the story. They expanded their learning of literacy through-out the room with puppets, three little pigs story sequencing, lost and wanted posters and acting out the story in the garden.

Learning to work together through games and puzzles has been a focus this month, encouraging cooperation, sharing with our friends.

Within our outdoor environment we have been taking part in a lot of active, energetic and challenging games and activities. We have been developing our co-ordination and balance skills with ball games and rings, encouraging cooperative play and team building through-out.

The children have been showing a big interest in imaginative play and we have had many tea parties in the garden we used our creative skills to make tea, hot chocolate with marshmallows and yummy cakes with sand and water.

We will be starting our Christmas crafts this week and decorating our banana pod.







- The babies have been exploring all things that roll both indoors and outdoors. Indoors they
- have been explored anything round that they could roll including the wheels on the trike, cushions, balls, cars and trains. They have also been investigating and problem solving as the they try to roll things that are not round. Outdoors they have moved to bigger things such as tyres, cable reels, tubes and pipes. The babies really enjoy being outside as they have more space to experiment without crashing into each other.
- This type of play is Schematic play and this is a rotational schema. Other things the
- children might do at home are twirling around, rolling their bodies, turning the taps on and
 off and winding and unwinding balls of string.
- Gwen is developing a mud kitchen so any donations of kitchen utensils, pots, baking trays, metal or wooden bowls would be gratefully received.




Treat Fund and Fund Raiser
