# Drop off and collection

Thank you for your support in making the drop off and collection of children as safe and smooth as possible. Can we please ask that you leave the playground as soon as possible after dropping off or collecting your child as when the school is closed we will be making as much use as possible of all the outdoor areas.

Please remember to hand your child's bag to the staff member collection them at the gate.

## **Children's Belongings**

- Please use the drawstring bags that were supplied by the nursery to transport the children's belongings to and from the nursery. These bags should be carried by an adult and handed over to staff.
- Children should arrive at nursery dressed ready for outdoor play as they will be given the choice of staying out or going in when they arrive.
- Please ensure your child has indoor shoes for when they are playing indoors.
- Recently we have had to call some parents to bring a change of clothes, please ensure your child always has spare clothing in their bag at all times and if toilet training they may need multiple changes.
  - Please also ensure if your child is in nappies or pull ups that you always check with staff if they need more nappies/wipes or pull ups.
    - The windows will be opened for ventilation so please put a jumper or zipper in your child's bag in case they need it.

Unfortunately, we do not have space to store indoor, spare clothing, outdoor clothing or shoes so please use the bag to bring these daily. If you have lost or misplaced your child's bag please let us know and we can give you another one.

# Children's Learning 3-5 Rooms

## Banana Pods

The children have really been enjoying risky play. They have been jumping off different heights to see how far and how high they could jump, balancing on beams and using a variety of resources to make climbing frames.

They have also been participating in physical activities such as obstacle courses, tig and hide and seek.

We have visited the school garden a number of times the children have enjoyed exploring all the new things the children from the school have built. Over the course of these visits the children's confidence has grown with climbing, balancing and jumping.

The children have been participating in various Science activities. They been learning about solar systems, names of the planets and painting their own planets.

We've been exploring real food in the house area and using playdough to make different foods, they made loads of yummy cakes and biscuits with it.

The children have been showing a big interest in dinosaurs they explored ice and melting it to discover the dinosaurs inside. They also took part in a dinosaur number hunt. They have been learning all the names of the dinosaurs and what ones were carnivore, herbivore and omnivore.

## Strawberry Pod

One of our Dad's very kindly came and dug up the garden area and the children have planted a wild flower bed which they hope will attract lots of insects in the future. They have also planted flowers and vegetables and are looking after they well, hopefully they will have some tasty vegetables soon. The children have also been visiting the school garden and making use of the space to develop their gross motor skills as well as explore the natural environment.

The staff and children have been participating in mile long walks whenever possible and I am sure they would be happy to show you their route.

Some of the children have started a block of Play on Pedals and another group will be starting up soon.

There have also been some starts and the children have been supporting them and helping them to feel safe and secure and build relationship with the staff. The older children have been working hard to get ready for school with a range of different experiences.

## Sun Safety

The NHS recommends that from March to October in the UK, children should:

- cover up with suitable clothing
- spend time in the shade, particularly from 11am to 3pm
- wear at least SPF30 sunscreen

Please help us keep your child safe by applying sunscreen before they come to Nursery and supplying spare to be reapplied when required. The nursery has an emergency supply of factor 50 \*\*\*\*\* rated suncream. If you need some, please ask a member of staff.

It is also important that children are suitable dressed with shoulders covered and wearing a hat. Sandals, crocs and flip flops are not suitable for children to wearing nursery as they are running and climbing and these can cause trips and falls very easily.
